


Vipre Internet Security 2013 (Updated and Default Settings)

According to my testing's, vipre has done amazing in web blocking, but the sad thing is that if some websites do pass and you run them, then it's not going to get caught later because vipre does not have good behavioral blocking. By the way, when I say behavioral blocking is not good, it's not because of my review, I've tested this antivirus about 3 months ago with 8 files and it didn't detect them and if you watch "pc Security," he even says it's not good. Basically watch any reviews on YouTube executing files and it won't detect it. Hopefully you'll have malwarebytes and hitmanpro to help you out. It's pretty low on ram usage and not heavy on system. It did excellent in detecting 663 out of 667 files that were thrown at vipre. I would recommend this antivirus to anybody looking for one. If they fix there behavioral blocking, then it could one of the best out there!
